To provide additional service to Santa Cruz County Fair attendees, METRO has created a special route, Route 79F, that will provide free daily service to the Watsonville Fairgrounds. Additionally, METRO will offer free service on the Route 79 weekend service and daily ParaCruz service to the fairgrounds in Watsonville. Fixed-Route customers can utilize Route 79F to get to the Fairgrounds daily, but the Route 79 will only provide service to the fairgrounds on September 16th – 17th.

Service will depart from the Watsonville Transit Center on the hour from noon – 10pm on weekdays and 10am – 10pm on weekdays and will offer a return trip from the County Fair at :25 past the hour from 12:25pm – 10:25pm on weekdays and 10:25pm on weekends.
